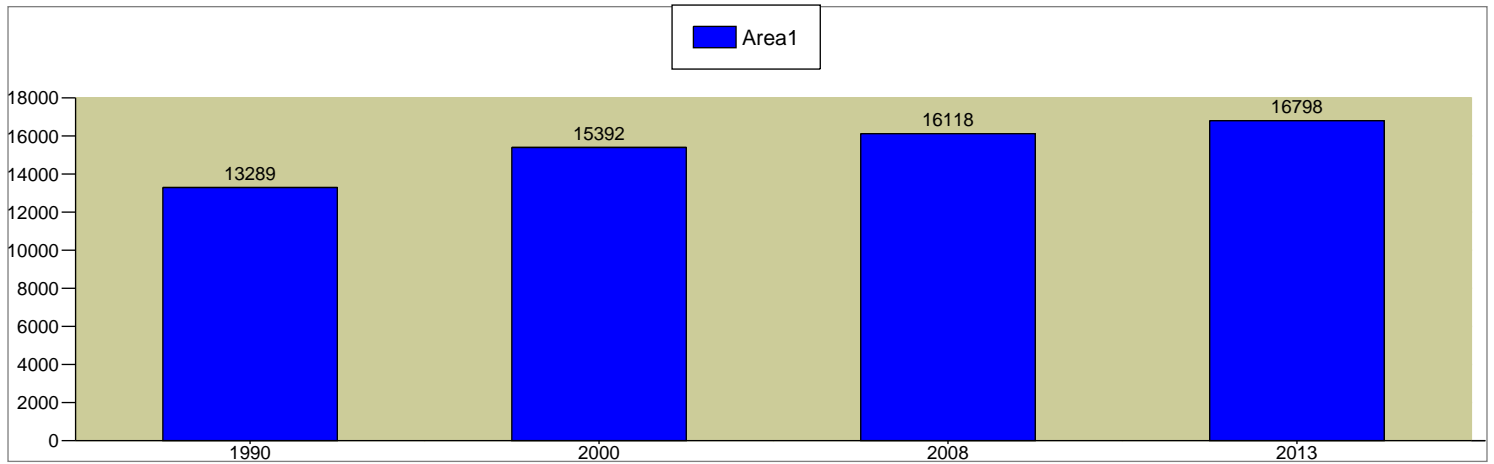




2000 - 2008 Population: Annual Rate

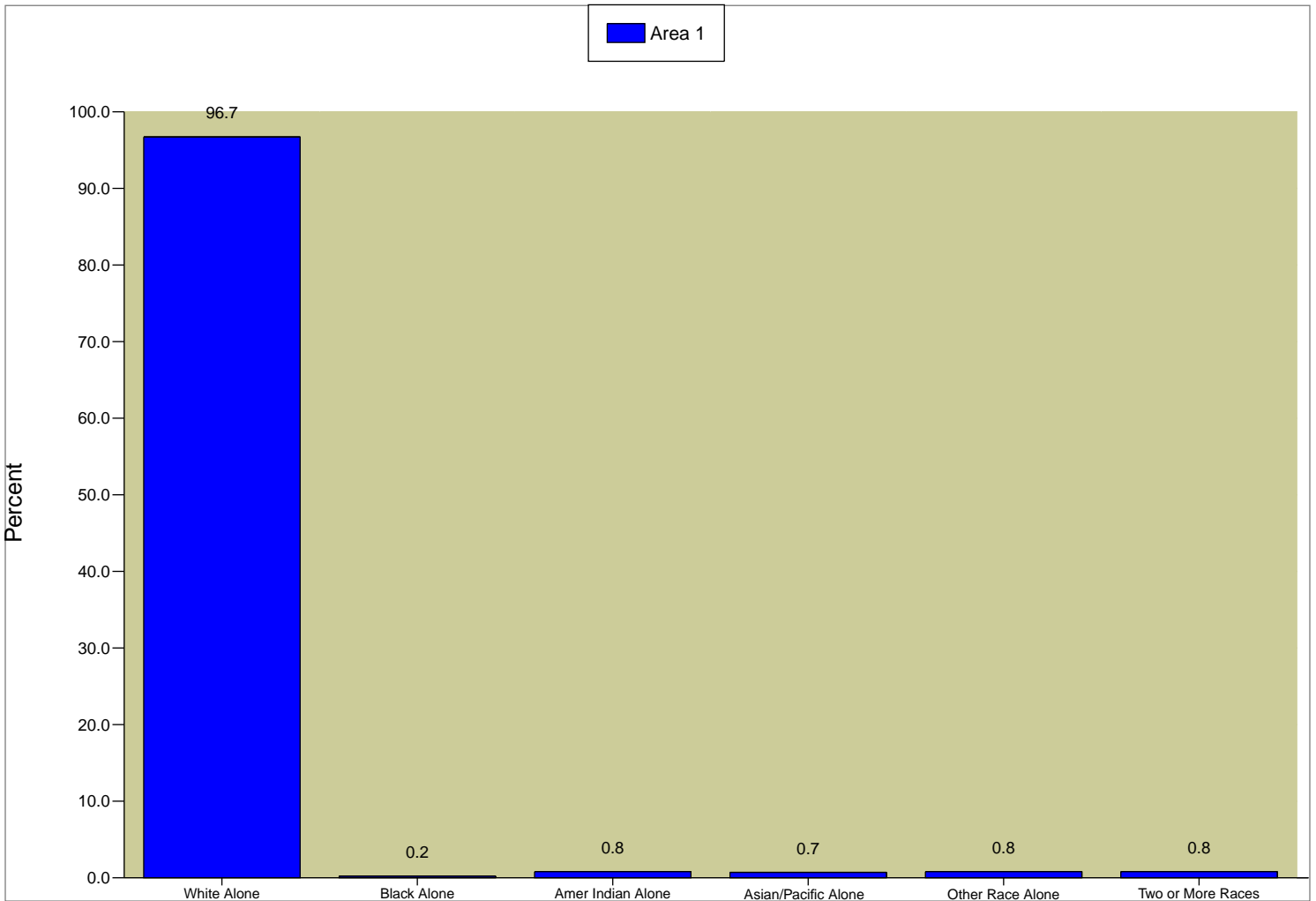

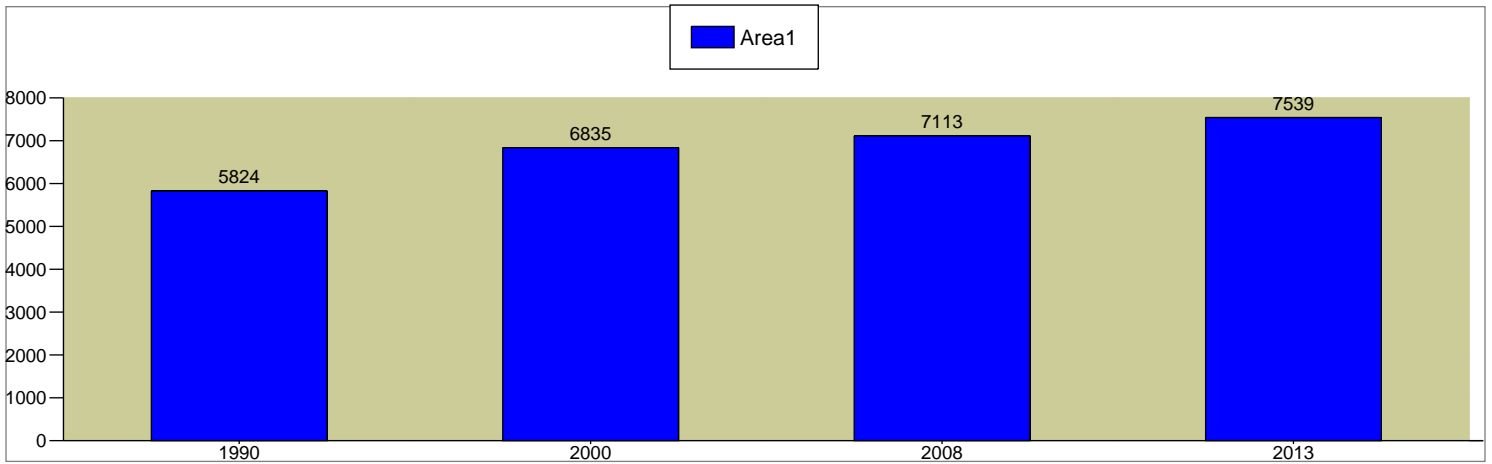

Total Civilian Employed Population 16+



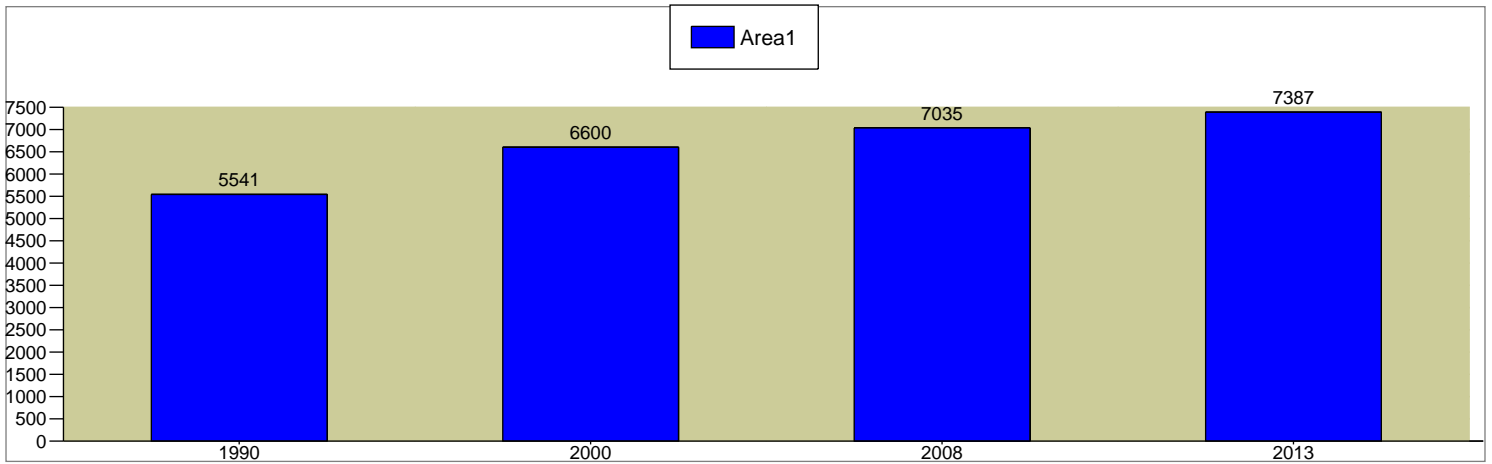
